February

March

April

- The Election of Trustees was set for August 2, 2013

May

• The Proposal Application was refined and distributed

June

- A Proposal Workshop was scheduled for July 24, 2013
- The Nomination Meeting for the Trustee Election was held June 20, 2013 and 11 candidates were nominated for 2 trustee positions

July

Election preparations

- The Trustee Election was held on August 2nd the successful candidates were Larissa Johnston (4 year term) and Elisa Levi (2 year term)
- Council appointed Paul Jones and Anthony Chegahno as Appointed Trustees
- The 2013 Proposal deadline was August 31, 2013 and 10 proposals were received

September

- The new Trustees reviewed and became familiar with the Trust Agreement
- The proposals were reviewed and four were approved:
 - o Chippewas of Nawash Fire Department rescue equipment and training
 - Chippewas of Nawash Home and Community Care Program Lifeline equipment and monitoring
 - o Chippewas of Nawash Post Secondary Assistance Program education support
 - o Chippewas of Nawash Unceded First Nation Comprehensive Community Plan

November

Investment training was provided by T.E.Wealth to the new Trustees

December

- Payments were processed for the approved proposals
- Preparations were made to review and improve the Proposal Application for 2014
- Developing improved communication with the beneficiaries was identified as an important priority for 2014
